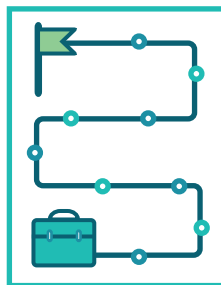
Heard of apprenticeships but not sure what they involve? Here's a quick guide to help you - or your child - explore this exciting route.

What is an Apprenticeship?

A paid role where you learn on the job while studying for a recognised qualification. Apprentices work with an employer for 1–6 years, earn a salary, receive holiday and employment rights, and build real, career-ready skills. Apprenticeships are open to anyone, regardless of age.

Why Consider This Pathway?

1. Career-ready skills employers value

3. Options across sectors – Digital, Engineering, Health, Creative, Agri-food and more
4. Clear progression into long-term careers

Apprentices balance work and study, so motivation and good time management are essential. Learning on the job is rewarding but requires commitment.

How You Can Support Your Child

- 1. Encourage & reassure:** Listen, guide, and keep options open.
- 2. Explore together:** Look at roles, attend open events, compare pathways.
- 3. Help with applications:** Support them in polishing their CV, personalising each cover letter, and preparing for interviews through simple practice questions.
